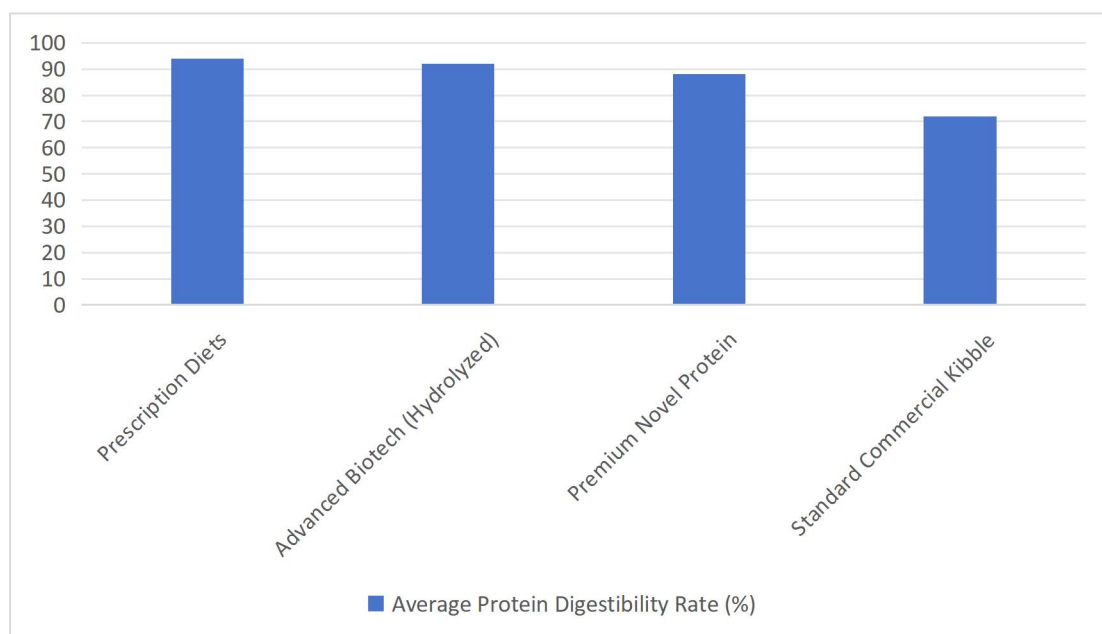

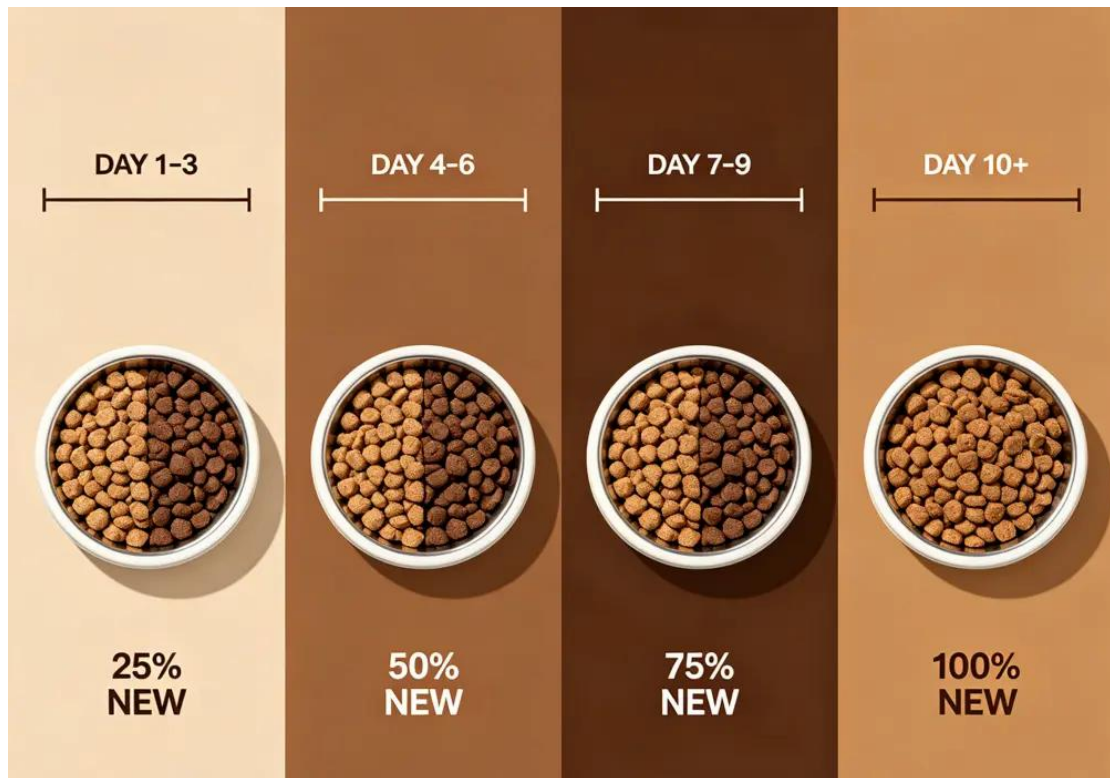
A sudden dietary switch will shock a sensitive gut and worsen loose stools. Always transition over a 7-to-10 day window:

- **Days 4-6:** 50% new specialized food mixed with 50% old food.
- **Days 7-10:** 75% new specialized food mixed with 25% old food, leading to a 100% switch.
