HEALTH INDICATOR	NORMAL (HEALTHY)	WARNING (CALL VET)
Gums & Breath	Bubblegum pink; neutral breath	Pale/Red gums; foul odor
Coat & Skin	Shiny, smooth, no dandruff	Dull, brittle, bald spots
Eyes & Ears	Clear eyes; clean, neutral ears	Cloudiness; yeasty odor
Behavior	Energetic, eager to play	Sudden lethargy/withdrawal
Weight	Visible waist; can feel ribs	Obese or prominent bones



1.Fresh Breath and Pink Gums

One of the most immediate Signs of a Healthy Dog is their oral health. While “dog breath” is a common phrase, a healthy mouth shouldn’t smell offensive.

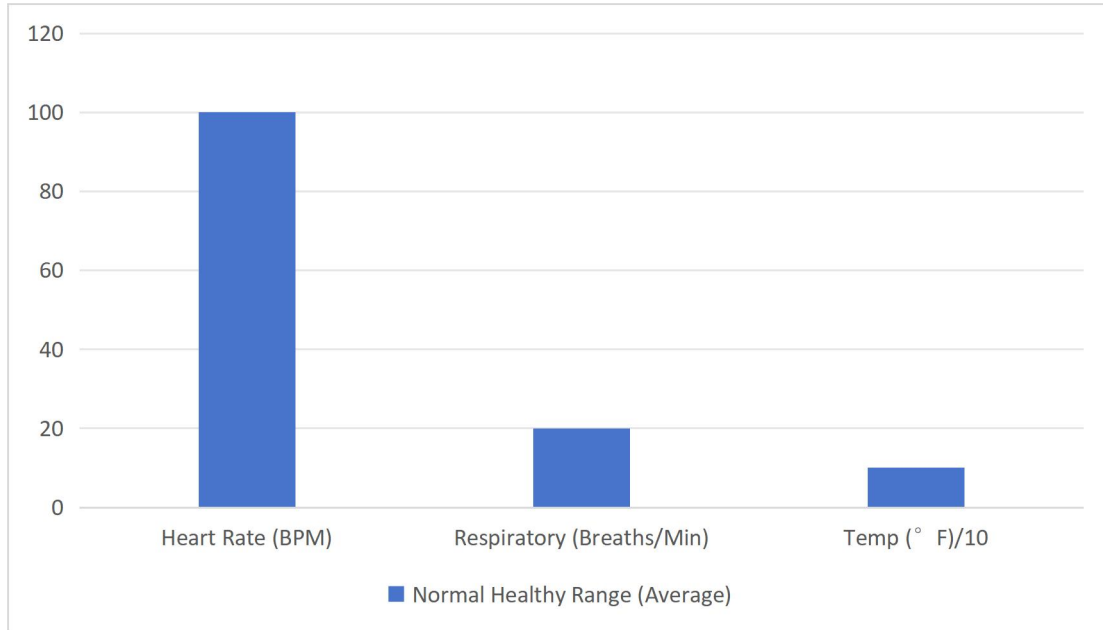
- The Look: Gums should be a healthy bubblegum pink (not white, red, or purple).
- The Test: When pressed, the pink color should return to the gums within 2 seconds.

2.Lustrous Coat and Supple Skin

A shiny, smooth coat is a reflection of internal nutrition. If your dog’s fur is brittle or excessively oily, it could indicate a deficiency. Maintaining this luster is often achieved by including [best dog foods with omega 3 fatty acids](#) in their diet.

Ranges vary by breed size. Consistently staying within these zones is one of the strongest Signs of a Healthy Dog.



3. Predictable Digestion and Appetite

A healthy dog has a consistent appetite and regular bowel movements. Stools should be firm and easy to pick up. If you notice sudden changes, it's worth reviewing our list of [toxic dog foods to avoid](#) to ensure no accidents have occurred.

4. Interest in Play and Socialization

Physical health and mental well-being are inseparable. A dog that is eager to greet you at the door or play with their favorite toy shows excellent mental vitality.

5. Clear Eyes and Alert Ears

The eyes should be clear, bright, and free of thick discharge or cloudiness. Similarly, the ears should be clean and smell neutral—excessive wax or a “yeasty” odor can indicate an infection.

6. Ideal Body Condition

Maintaining a stable weight is among the key Signs of a Healthy Dog. You should be able to feel their ribs under a thin layer of fat, and they should have a visible waistline.

7. Skin Elasticity and Hydration

In a healthy dog, the skin should snap back into place instantly after a gentle “skin pinch” at the back of the neck.

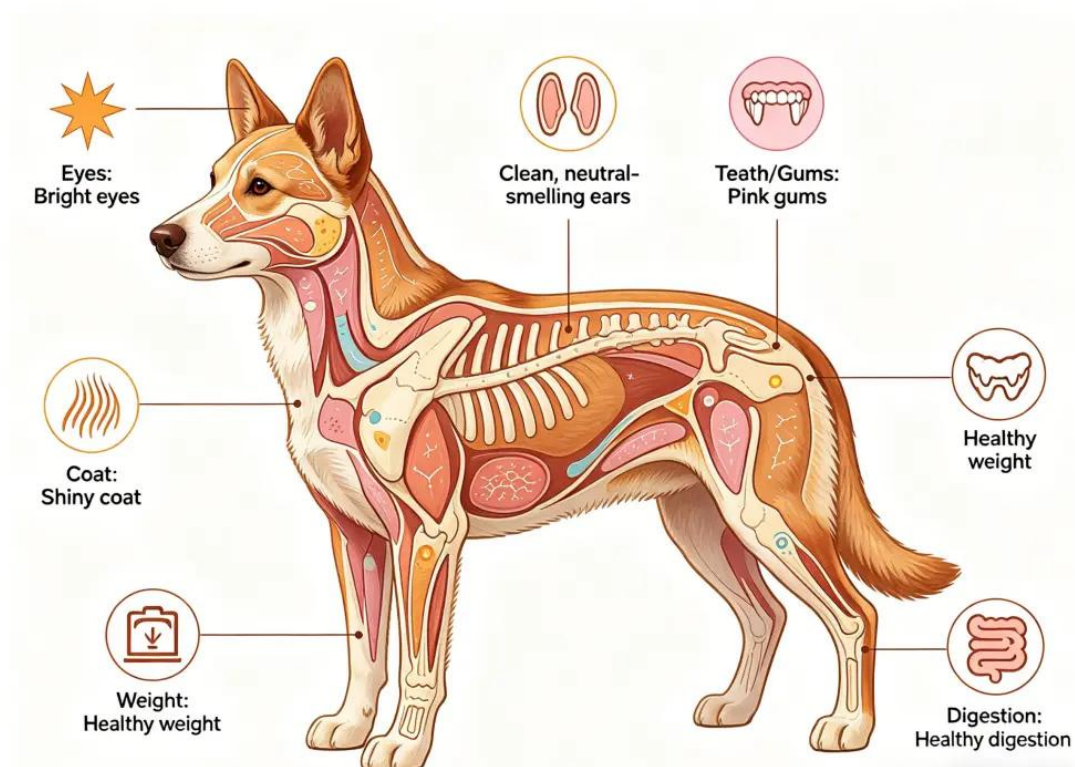
Quick Health Checklist
