- **Underlying Medical Issues:** Persistent symptoms can sometimes point to deeper issues like intestinal parasites, bacterial infections, or Inflammatory Bowel Disease (IBD) that require a vet's attention.



Key Ingredients to Look For

- **Prebiotics and Probiotics:** Chronic loose stools strip the gut of beneficial microflora. Active probiotics help restock the good bacteria, directly strengthening their natural immune barrier.
- **Soluble Fiber:** Natural fiber sources like pure pumpkin or beet pulp act like a sponge in the colon, drawing out excess water to physically firm up the stool.

Ingredients to Keep Out of the Bowl

- **Artificial Additives:** Chemical preservatives, artificial colorings, and synthetic flavors offer zero nutritional value and frequently trigger stomach lining irritation.
- **Excessively High Fat Levels:** Rich, fatty foods take much longer to empty from the stomach and place a heavy processing strain on both the pancreas and the liver.
- **Vague Fillers and By-Products:** Avoid cheap, ambiguous terms like “animal by-product meal” or heavy doses of corn, wheat, and soy, which are incredibly difficult for a compromised gut to break down.

Days 5- 6	25%	75%
Day 7 and Beyond	0%	100%
